Aims:

- To equip general dentists and oral surgeons with practical knowledge to assess, plan, and manage haem-onc patients effectively.
- To provide insights into long-term care and strategies for managing complications in haem-onc patients.

Objectives:

- Identify key considerations when assessing and planning treatment, including risks associated with therapies like bisphosphonates (e.g., Zometa).
- Gain insights into long-term care strategies for haem-onc patients and how to anticipate and manage treatment failures.
- Apply theoretical knowledge to real-world scenarios through case-based discussions to improve decision-making and patient outcomes.

Ms Jashme Patel, Consultant Oral Surgeon, King's College Hospital

Jashme qualified as a dentist at King's College London and developed her interest in Oral Surgery whilst working at Guy's Hospital and Eastman Dental Hospital. After completing specialty training, Jashme now works as an Oral Surgery Consultant at

King's College Hospital. In addition to this, she provides Oral Surgery care in practice.

Her main focus is managing medically complex patients. This includes the caring for haemato-oncology, liver and renal disease patients. Furthermore, she is part of the bisphosphonate service, assessing patients prior to starting medications and managing the dental complications of these drugs.
